• This month, the technology department has made some purchases to streamline and enhance our users' experience. We were able to purchase a new

core switch, 12 workgroup laser printers, and 50 refurbished classroom computers.

- The new switch is a Cisco 3750G, which will provide much-needed core-layer functionality and gigabit interconnectivity speeds between our wiring closets. This switch will aggregate the connections from our access-layer switches and enable layer 2 redundancy, improving uptime and bandwidth utilization. This switching system will allow for further future growth. Virtualization of resources begins with a solid network foundation, and this purchase puts us in a strong position.
- We also procured 12 Samsung workgroup laser printers to replace the aging inkjets found in most of the classrooms. Inkjet printers, particularly older models like the ones we have, are notoriously poor performers in almost all categories: performance, durability, price per page, and lifetime of consumables, among others. With these new printers, one of which will go to each grade level and a few other select locations, we will save a non-trivial amount of money in ink purchases alone. The fact that the new printers are networkable will also provide enhanced failover options. Local printing will now be a much better option for our teachers than it has been in the past.
- Finally, we purchased 50 refurbished computers to clean out the remaining Windows 98 PCs. These machines, Dell Optiplex GX 270s, run Windows XP, which is really the minimum acceptable Microsoft operating system in any computing environment today. Students will be able to take advantage of real, functional computer centers in the classroom, with all of the educational and real-life benefits that provides.
