- The administration, along with Mrs. Buchalter, attended a training session for online policies. Board members will receive training in January. Everyone will get a personal password.
- 7. Core Curriculum and Technology (Chairperson Ellen Suckle)
  - We changed Internet Service Providers (ISPs) on December 4<sup>th</sup>, installed permanent replacements for some faulty equipment, ordered parts to upgrade two servers, and received and set up a set of responders.
  - Our new ISP is Comcast Commercial Services, who has a much stronger infrastructure and better support than our old ISP, Camnet. The actual switchover itself went relatively smoothly, with only a few minor bumps; these were mostly related to the few remaining Windows 98 computers we have. Those will be replaced with new machines that are already on-site as soon as possible. E-mail delivery and Internet connectivity were delayed by only a couple of hours while the Comcast tech was performing the installation and the Internet's DNS servers were being updated with our new information. Thanks go out to our staff for being patient and supportive throughout the switchover.
  - We had two switches, a router, and an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) all fail toward the end of last month, and all of that equipment has now been replaced. The router was under warranty, so securing a new one was no trouble. The switches and UPS were underpowered in the role they were performing, so more robust equipment is now operational in their places. We now have a much more resilient capacity to the desktop, and outages should be few and far between.
  - Toward the end goal of virtualizing our servers and storage, we have ordered redundant power supplies and processors for the newest two of our servers (which are both 4-5 years old) to give them the ability to shoulder the load of having several virtual machines running on them. This will certainly help in the meantime, before we virtualize, as well; having more fault-tolerance is always good for reliability, and the extra processing power can only improve performance.
  - Finally, under the direction of the Superintendent, we have ordered and received a classroom set of responders. These devices are incredibly useful for student feedback, and have been shown to enhance the learning experience in districts that have made use of them. Mrs. Martin is piloting their use for a couple of weeks, after which they will become available for sharing school-wide
