- The board received training on Strauss Esmay before the meeting this evening.
- 7. Core Curriculum and Technology (*Chairperson Ellen Suckle*)
 - The new calendar year is off to a good start. Unlike last month, we have had no major service interruptions. We've had another successfully- administered MAP testing season thanks to the Title I Department, and have received the five new sets of classroom responders from Renaissance Learning. We have also revised our network documentation to more accurately reflect the current state of the network.
 - Also this month, MRA International (an HP vendor) came in to demonstrate storage area network (SAN) arrays from HP's Lefthand division. Because of the advanced age of our servers, it is becoming increasingly important to assemble an equipment replacement plan. While we could maintain the status quo and simply purchase new machines, this option is much less attractive than it used to be due to the maturation of data center virtualization technologies. A more robust (and cost- effective) plan would entail consolidating our six servers onto two physical machines and incorporating a shared- storage SAN for our storage needs. The fact that this would result in at least a 50% reduction in server power use is only one of the benefits we would see. This would also be a more resilient setup in the face of either hardware or software failure, as the two servers would host one pool of resources with failover capability. It would also be highly scalable. If our storage, processing, or throughput needs should increase (and they constantly do), it would be a simple matter to expand those resources.
 - The demonstrated SAN features remote replication and disaster-recovery capabilities. Thus, this equipment would allow for timely business continuity in the event of a catastrophe.
 - Finally, the Technology Department is working hard to complete the three-year Technology Plan, which is due to the county office of education in the middle of February. We will easily have the plan completed by the due date, thanks to assistance from the Administration and the preparatory background work already completed by the Technology Department.
