Mrs. Baker, 217 E. Atlantic Avenue inquired as to why field trips and extra curricular activities are being cut from the budget. Mrs. Baker believes those programs are educational and important for all students. Mr. Adams reviewed the PowerPoint slide that showed due to the loss of \$926,469 in state aid, cuts unfortunately had to be made to all areas in the district.

Ms. Sara Babli, 161 Ohio Avenue, inquired as to which class would increase in size with the cut in teaching staff. Mr. Adams explained that with the proposed 2010-2011 school budget, one grade level would be affected from the standpoint that there would be two classes instead of three. It was further explained that we are waiting to make the determination as to what grade level that will be until it is closer to the 2010-2011 school year so we have more accurate information regarding each grade level's enrollment.

Mrs. Yost, 39 Cherry Lane, asked what would be the outcome if the budget was defeated. Mr. Adams reviewed the PowerPoint slide that showed should the proposed budget be defeated, what some of the major at-risk items include.

Mayor Armbruster, 137 Garfield Avenue, thanked the Board and the administration for working so hard on the budget. He knows how difficult it is to do more with less. The borough was also cut more than \$500,000 in State Aid.
