Curriculum and Instruction Update

- We have been utilizing the state's database system called NJSMART. This system provides specific information about each of our students, much like our paper cumulative files. We send updates to this system on a continuous basis. Lately, we have been using this information to obtain more specific NJASK data to drive instruction.
- Faculty Meetings are being utilized to provide professional development to the entire staff. The most recent faculty meeting focused on Time Management. The purpose of this topic was to focus on a few time management systems for each classroom and student to assist them with organizing their assignments and prioritizing what needs to get accomplished. It also provides the students with more accountability on what is to be turned in and when, which is preparing them for high school.
- In an effort to continue articulation among Clementon Elementary and Overbrook, Dr. Koczur invited me to come over and observe their high school classes. I will provide you with an update when that occurs.

Technology Update

• This month, the Technology Department and Child Study Team completed the NJ Smart October 15 data submissions as mandated by the state Department of Education. The next NJ Smart submission, the Pre-ID submission, is due in December, and work will begin shortly on that.

- The district has purchased and received 12 new Smart Boards, most of which will go to our special education classrooms and the regular education classrooms that do not currently have one. The teachers and students are excited, and we look forward to this latest infusion of technology to further enhance the students' educational experience.
