- 1. Administrative Evaluation (Chairperson Randall Freiling)
 - Mr. Freiling reported that he met with Mrs. Marcus for her evaluation, which is due in April/May. Mrs. Marcus will complete her section of the evaluation. Mr. Freiling will compile the information for the board. He will meet with the Committee and then send out the evaluation form for each board member to complete. You must remember that Mrs. Marcus's goals are included in her evaluation this year. Forms will be distributed sometime next week.

- Mr. Weyland reported that Blue Sky will be coming out to inspect the roof as part of their proposal for the solar project.
- 3. Camden County Educational Services Commission (Representative Virginia de Haan; Alternate William Weyland)
 - Mrs. de Haan reported that the 192/193 program is in the red as the State has decreased funding by 15%. With the closing of so many schools, the need for services is decreasing. Currently teachers are going into the classroom to assist students. The Commission is requesting an increase in administrative fees for next year. They are also starting a preschool program in September and will be providing before and after school care for children at a nominal fee.

- 7. Core Curriculum and Technology

(Chairperson - Ellen Suckle)

Mrs. Suckle reported on the following:

Curriculum

• The Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade teachers have been working with administration, Title I, and the American Reading Company with the implementation of the Independent Reading Level Assessment (IRLA). We have already had 4 professional development days with the company. This week the presenter visited every classroom and sat with each teacher to observe and offer suggestions for implementation. Administration and Title I also visited the classrooms and observed the teachers and listened to students read. The staff have been really dedicated to implementing this new program.

NJASK

• The NJASK is quickly approaching. As you may have heard, the state was granted the NCLB waiver. Part of the waiver includes the elimination of AYP. We are unclear how this will be handled with the upcoming test. We do know that the state will determine where your school falls in one of the three categories (Priority school, Focus school, Reward school). As of right now we are not listed in any of these categories based on the lists I have seen. We have been told that not every school will fit into one of these categories.

Race To The Top

- The state was awarded money for their application for the Race To The Top (RTTT). Our school is eligible to receive funds from RTTT. As of right now we are looking to receive almost \$17,000. I did apply for the funds (application is attached) and we are entitled to use the funds for the following:
 - ~ Professional development for Common Core State Standards

- \sim Implementation of the Instructional Improvement System (IIS) in the Fall 2013
- ~ Implementation of the teacher and leader evaluation system
- ~ Implementation of State's science and math curriculum based on CCSS

Technology

- This month, the Technology Department continued to resolve routine issues at the endpoint, network, storage, and server levels. We are seeing a slight uptick in motherboard failures on our fleet of Dell Optiplex GX 270s. It may become more of an issue when the warranty runs out on these machines, but that isn't for another year. Introducing newer computers into the district will help to alleviate this.
- The Technology Department also continues to update NJ Smart and keep aware of changes in the NJ DOE data collection system. NJ Smart is introducing a new submission this summer for course information to go along with all of the end-of-year submissions already in place. This new initiative will allow the NJ DOE to tie students to staff members and the courses they participate in. With any luck, this will be the final new submission for a while with this, the NJ DOE will have fulfilled the US DOE's requirements for data collection.
