  - Mr. Freiling was not present for a report.

# 2. Building and Maintenance

(Chairperson – William Weyland)

- Mr. Weyland reported that everyone is back into their respective classrooms after our small flood. We have new carpet, cabinets and countertops. Supplies lost are being reordered.
- At our BCIP State Dinner, Clementon was named Safety School of the Year. We received a total of \$7,000.00 for participating in a Safety Committee, having a great record of worker's compensation claims, and Safety School of the Year.
- 3. Camden County Educational Services Commission (*Representative – Virginia de Haan; Alternate – William Weyland*)
  - Mrs. de Haan reported that the Commission approved having alternate representatives. Mr. Weyland will go to the January meeting. The audit report was presented with no recommendations. The superintendent has been in contact with Middlesex County Commission. We will be partnering with them for services. A new HVAC system is needed. The cost will be approximately \$96,000.00. The Commission had a very profitable year with busing services. The superintendent proposed giving raises to the teachers working at the detention center as well as the secretaries.

  - Mrs. Suckle reported on the workshop which discusses getting the community more involved with PARCC testing. Mount Laurel School District discussed how they were able to get more parents involved.
- 5. Community Education and Extra-Curricular Information

(Chairperson – John Romer)

- Mr. Romer reported that the Penny Party was once again a success. They made a profit of \$2,113.66 which will fund the upcoming programs for the year. At Camp Clementon, the students are decorating for Thanksgiving. We will be having Breakfast with Santa as well as the Holiday Parade and tree lighting.

- Mrs. Buchalter reported there is nothing new this month.
- 7. Common Core Curriculum and Technology (*Chairperson Ellen Suckle*)
  - Mrs. Suckle reported on the following:

**Item 16: Pilot Programs** - Over the past few months we have been talking about piloting different reading and math programs. You had the opportunity to see the samples that we reviewed to consider piloting. The staff and I have agreed on these to be piloted in their classrooms this year. They are aware that they are to be used as a resource and not a sole item to teach from for every lesson, everyday. I also wanted you to be aware that it is ok that different grades are doing different companies. Since we are only using these as a resource we will be able to see if either program is better than the other. They all have Common Core in them but we want to see which one will fit our needs.

**Item 17: Textbooks** - Since we have updated a variety of policies on curriculum and textbooks, I wanted to make sure we have adopted, officially, the textbooks we have been using as a resource over the past few years. This is just following the policies we

have in place. This will also help identify text that we need to consider updating as a part of the changing standards. This is also part of the policy.

**Item 18: Supplemental Resources** - I wanted to keep track, and officially approve, the variety of supplemental resources that we have purchased over several years. Although we don't have to officially approve them, I thought it couldn't hurt to have them on the agenda with the other items so the teachers can see we offer them a variety of resources to assist with their teaching. This also helps with keeping an inventory of what we have, what we might need, or what is outdated.

# **Technology:**

- This month, the Technology Department uploaded more data to NJ Smart, and achieved a 0% error rate on all three submissions: state, special education, and staff. This will reflect positively on our QSAC scores. The next NJ Smart submission will be due in January, which is for Pre-ID labels for the ACCESS for ELLs test.
- Also this month, the district recycled more than 800 pounds of waste computer equipment. This is 800 pounds' worth of material that will not be put in a landfill!

• Mrs. de Haan reported the DRTRS (transportation) report is completed. Working on ASSA (Annual School State Aid) report, which is due December 5, 2014. At our Tri-County Meeting last week, we were advised to create two budgets this year for the 2015-2016 school year – one with flat funding and one with a 2% decrease in state aid. (A 2% decrease equals \$128,468.00.)
